## Informational Guidelines to Submitting the NOI to Homeschool

A separate Notice of Intent to Homeschool must be filed for each child before beginning to homeschool the child:

- 1) When the child reaches the age at which attendance at a public school becomes mandatory pursuant to NRS 392.040 or
- 2) Not later than 10 days after the child has been formally withdrawn from enrollment in public school; or
- 3) Not later than 30 days after establishing residency in this state
- 4) The parent must refile if the name or address of the parent/child changes, or the child is re-entering homeschooling after being enrolled in another school.

File only the single page form above, along with the education plan (see NHN website for suggestions), either by mail with a US Postal Return Receipt Card (recommended) or in person, with the Superintendent of Schools of the school district in which the child resides. The form above is in accordance with NRS 388D.020 and 388D.050.

The school district must provide the parent with a written "acknowledgment of receipt" which shall be deemed proof of compliance with Nevada's compulsory attendance law and the school district shall retain a copy of the written acknowledgement for not less than 15 years. NRS 388D.020 (7)

Parents should keep a copy of the NOI and Education Plan that is filed along with all "receipts" of submission in a safe place for easy accessibility in the event the child's homeschool status is questioned.

The school district shall process a written request for a copy of records relating to a child who is or was homeschooled, or any information contained therein, not later than 5 days after receiving the request. Records may only be released to a person or entity if required by a specific statute, or upon suitable proof of identity of the parent (or the child if 18 or older) that is making the request. NRS 388D.030
